Safeguarding Procedures

Welcome to Grasmere Primary School. As a visitor, volunteer or someone who has come to work with or for our children in any capacity, it is important that you are aware of our Safeguarding procedures.

The school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff, volunteers and visitors to share this commitment.

We have a Safeguarding Policy and procedures in place. At the heart of this is the belief that all people in the school community have a responsibility to respond to any concerns they have about a child's wellbeing.

If you are concerned about a child's welfare, <u>please speak</u> <u>directly to Nick Mallender or Debbie Ashton who are the Safeguarding Leads in our school</u>.

In his absence you must speak to Pembe Hassan who is safeguarding deputy at Grasmere.

'Cause for Concern' forms are available in the office for you to record your concern. All information is treated with the strictest of confidence, in line with our Safeguarding Policy.

Full details will be recorded, including: the date, time, child's name, your name and a factual account of what happened, what was said and what was observed. **DO NOT** conduct your own investigation and keep all concerns and information confidential.

Visitors to school who may have tablets, mobile phones or cameras with them are reminded that under school safeguarding requirements they are not permitted to use these devices on the premises to record images of pupils or distribute images

You may be concerned if:

- You see an injury
- Another person expresses concerns
- A child tells you something

If a child tells you something, this information needs to be passed on:

- Do not promise confidentiality (there can be no secrets)
- Re-assure the child that they have done the right thing
- Listen but do not ask leading questions
- Record and pass on your concerns

Your help in supporting our safeguarding work is appreciated by the school and most importantly, by the children and young people we serve.

Fire Precautions



In the event of fire, the alarm sounds continuously. At this time everyone must leave the building immediately. The nearest fire exit must be used—all of them are clearly marked.

The assembly point is the Key Stage 2 playground.

If you discover a fire, sound the alarm by breaking glass of one of the red call points.

These are situated in many classrooms and throughout other areas of the school and indicated in each classroom.

First Aid



In the event of an accident please contact a member of staff who will assist you and enlist the help of one of the registered first aiders. The names and photos of our first aiders on the corridor, next to hall entrance.

All accidents must be reported and will be recorded accordingly.

If you have a medical condition of which you would like us to be aware so that we can offer some help, should it be necessary, please inform a member of staff on arrival.

Smoking

Grasmere Primary School operates a no smoking policy. This applies to all buildings and all the grounds.

Asbestos Register

There is no asbestos in any accessible area of the school.

Grasmere do an annual check to confirm this. All contractors must read and sign the asbestos register on arrival before commencing any work.
