During maths week, *Sky Brown class* enjoyed listening to and acting out songs such as 'Five Little Monkeys.' We also played maths games such as seeing how many quoits we could throw into the hoop. Games like this help us to subitise and learn our number bonds to 5.



Nursery

For Maths Week, *Pavlova Class* have been learning to recognise groups of objects and count them correctly. We made ladybirds out of plasticine and we practiced counting their spots. We learnt that we need to touch each spot saying the numbers in the right order and the last number is how many!

Year One - Rosen Class

Year 1 enjoyed their activities for Maths Week. We are practicing our Number Bonds to ten using lots of different structures. We have been learning how to use a 'Rekenrek' to show our knowledge of Number Bonds.



Year Two - Simone Biles Class

In Simone Biles Class we thought about why people wear poppies for Remembrance Day. We read the poem In Flanders Fields and thought about the words used in the poem. We read a simple poem about poppies and made actions to retell the poem. We added our own lines to the poem thinking about what poppies mean to us. Some children said they represented being kind or peace and others of people who have died in wars.






Year Three - Rashford Class


Year Four - Malala Class




Malala Class have been considering the question, "What was Ancient Mayan writing like?" and have enjoyed translating our names this week.
