RECEPTION - SKY BROWN CLASS



YEAR ONE - ROSEN CLASS



Year 4 have been using branching keys in science this week. We learnt that they're used to classify animals by their characteristics. We used them to classify different sweet!




YEAR FIVE - KADEENA COX CLASS

As part of Holocaust memorial day, Year 5 learnt about Sir Nicholas Winton and the Kindertransport. He was a young British stockbroker who, during the 1930s before WW2 started, decided that he would do everything possible to save the lives of as many Jewish children as he could. He risked his life to successfully save 669 mostly Jewish children from Czechoslovakia during The Jewish Holocaust by ensuring their safe passage to Britain.



YEAR SIX - SIR CAPTAIN TOM MOORE CLASS

'Year 6 have been reflecting on Holocaust Memorial Day, learning and remembering about all the people that lost their lives. We shared the story 'Terrible Things' by Eva Bunting, an allegory of the Holocaust. We learnt about Nicholas Winton and the Kindertransport programme which saved a lot of children.
