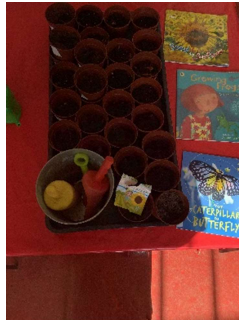
NURSERY – ANNA PAVLOVA CLASS

Year 4 Malala have been loving British Science Week. We found out how scientists determine the age of a shark. We've been enquiring whether we can determine the age of a human based off their height too.



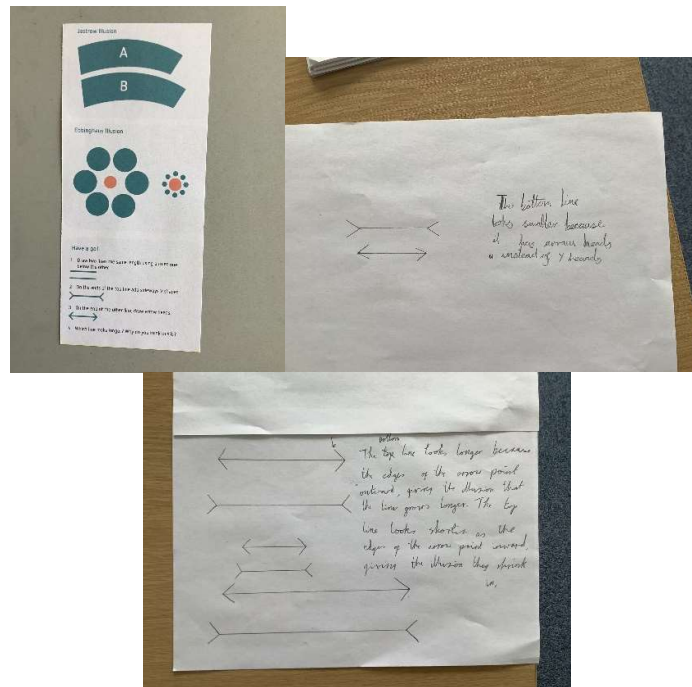
YEAR FIVE – KADEENA BILES CLASS
