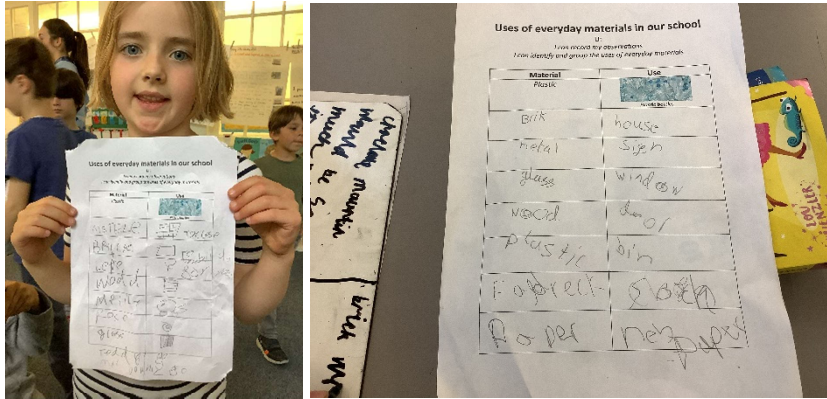
Year one – Rosen class

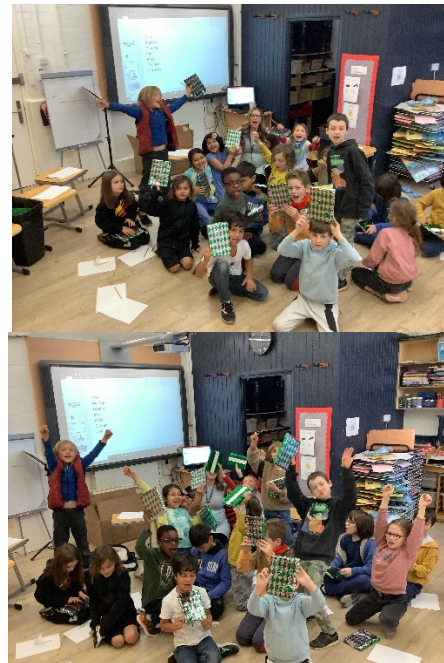
Year two – Simone Biles class
