In Reception we have been learning about our bodies. We drew round our friend's bodies and then talked about the parts of the bodies we know and what they do.




Year one – Dolly Parton class


Year four – Jimmy Cliff class

In Spanish this week, we translated statements about our history unit, The Second World War. We're loving our Spanish lessons with Raquel!



Donating items

We accept cereal; soup; pasta; rice; tinned tomatoes/ pasta saucel; lentils, beans and pulses; tinned meat; tinned vegetables; tea/coffee; tinned fruit; biscuits; UHT milk; fruit juice; baby food. Also needed are toiletries, nappies etc

Collecting items

Anyone who needs these items can collect them from the shelf in the mornings. The school will leave the hallway doors open from about 9.10 after the drop off crowds have gone. You can wait in the courtyard or come back – just ring the main bell on Albion Road and say Sharing shelves and the office will let you in.
