






### Year five - Duke Ellington class

Year 6 celebrated anti-bullying this week by discussing the theme of 'reaching out'. We talked about who we could reach out to and the qualities people we trust share.






# THE FAMILY COACH SERVICE'S PARENT SUPPORT GROUPS - AUTUMN TERM 2
