
# Year 3 – Big Ben class – Autumn 1 This half term, Year 3 will be studying the following:

# Place Value Addition Subtraction

focus The principal mathematics teaching in lower key stage 2 is to ensure that increasingly pupils become fluent with whole numbers and the 4 operations, including number facts and the concept of place value. This should ensure that pupils develop efficient written and mental methods and perform calculations accurately with increasingly large whole numbers.
