#### Something I noticed this week....



As head teacher I always have the privilege of walking around the classrooms every day to see the range of learning. It is incredible to witness the journey from the very young 3 year olds right up to Year 6 about to spread their wings and depart on their next learning journey into secondary school. The sophistication of a year 6 child's knowledge and skills and how they apply it is always interesting. Here we see it in their art work, taking in the art of a famous artist, and developing their own work. This work on display shows the confidence and skill our children have.

# Parent feedback....

I was asked by a parent recently how we ensure continuity across the classes. Staff have weekly staff meetings and briefings, and this is where we information share as well as develop our professional knowledge. It's then up to our very skilled staff to interpret this in their classes. We ensure that the teaching across the school is quality first, whilst also allowing for the skill and the personality of the teaching staff to shine through. This all adds to the creative culture of our school.

#### How do we teach about...

Different religious festivals. At this time of year there are many key religious festivals including but not exclusive to: Advent, Christmas, Hannukah and Divali. Our job is to teach children so that they have religious knowledge and tolerance. This is learnt by learning about different religions and drawing on similarities across them all. The lessons are appropriate to all.

#### News from the classes...

#### Nursery – London Eye class

For Coding Week, we asked the children to think like a computer programmer. We made a maze on the floor and one child acted as the computer and one as the programmer. The programmer had to give instructions to help the blindfolded computer through the maze. We also used mazes on the whiteboard in the same way.







# **Reception – William Morris class**

In William Morris class as part of Coding Week we looked at Tangrams. This linked to our Maths work on four sided shapes. We looked at how Coding and Algorithms are often a list of instructions that makes or produces something. We looked at the instructions we used for making shape pictures with the shapes from a Tangram. We cut up squares of origami paper and made shape pictures. We discussed the instructions we used and how sometimes we used the wrong instruction and needed to change them. We enjoyed making the shape pictures.







#### **Year One – Kew Gardens Class**

Kew Gardens Class really enjoyed their coding lesson this week. We used our knowledge of directions to help direct our pom-pom monster out of a maze. Then we used our knowledge of shapes to plot a new maze for our pom-pom monster and create lots of interesting obstacles! We showed fantastic teamwork as we worked together to solve the puzzle and set new challenges!








#### Year Two – St Paul's class

In St Paul's class this week we had an experience with coding and artificial intelligence in a safe and creative environment. This lesson was filled with moments of joy, where students use code to choreograph a dance spectacle of colour and movement using simple drag-and-drop coding blocks.



# **Year Three – Big Ben class**

This week in Year 3, we've had a great time working on our coding skills in Computing. We used a program called Scratch to place and arrange blocks into scripts that we could then run by pressing the green flag icon. Great fun making our characters move around the screen!



# **Year Four – Tower Bridge class**

We had a fantastic week this week! The children loved the Christmas celebrations and had a wonderful hour of code with Sarah. We used Scratch to create our own animations and collaborated with our partners really well. Well done year 4!

# **Year Five – Ally Pally class**

This week, Ally Pally class enjoyed participating in the hour of code by tackling the coding system to help Mario collecting coins! They worked well in their coding teams to identify any coding errors, and to debug them. Happy coding!







#### **Year Six – Globe Theatre class**

Year 6 have had a super week! We loved our trip to the panto on Wednesday, and Christmas jumper day and Christmas dinner on Thursday. We also really enjoyed our Hour of Code this week! We used the new Microbits to programme a flashing heart, our names, and even a game of rock, paper, scissors.
